but when mix knob is anywhere in between the volume is louder. most obvious when the mix knob is at 50... of course.

shouldn't the mix knob be balancing the 2 signals evenly?? so when the mix knob is set to 50... you get the same overall level... but with 50% no effect and 50% effect.
