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You do know that you can actually use Melodyne just like you would a second DAW, don't you? It is multitrack capable and if you've got something like an RME HDSP 9652 running on a slave DAW, you could sync this to Paris ADAT, fly whatever tracks you wanted to process over LAN to your slave DAW running Melodyne, and then lightpipe them back to a Paris channel while being processed in real time.

this is one of the most unbelievable audio programs I've ever seen. I just don't need all of it's functionality for what I do here. the new Cubase upgrade will likely do what I need. It's been a while since I used Paris so I don't know what it would take to use the Melodyne plugin, but it's VST, so I would imagine it would work with whatever wrapper you are using as long as you're running Win XP.
