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Possible Cable Solution Found. In pursuing this online, I caught a reference to the acronym VHDCI in describing this cable. I asked Magma tech support if the was indeed the descriptor for the cable, and got this response:

"We don't have this information available. I can only provide the general info, this old cable is a standard SCSI VHDCI.

NOTE: The new cable we have now is not a SCSI type cable."

Pursuing the VHDCI trail, I came upon this:
