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SSL bought it from CuiBonoSoft - it was EDL Convert Pro. Works great for converting EDLs, OMFs, etc (I use v4 - it's a lifesaver). The word from a v5 beta tester is that it does in fact convert PT7 projects to and from Nuendo XML and works very well.

The support for PT7 transfers is the new feature to v5 that could be a really big deal. Previously, due to Digi's lockout of PT session formats from 3rd party developers, you could only go back to PT5. Either CuiBono figured out 7, or Digi sees the writing on the wall about customers' desires to move between platforms and opened up the format to CuiBonoSoft/SSL.

It's also now twice the price it was, but still worth it.
