Well, it is in my current set up also, but I was thinking in the mind set of using Drumagog to replace the drums completely through triggers rather than just augmenting them. I use Drumagog to "add" to my acoustic drum tracks all the time, but sometimes I'd like to have totally synth or whacked out drum kit sounds.
