It was spam for a porn site, so I also got a half dozen or so emails yelling at me about how immoral porn is. Luckily, I got a copy of the spam message itself and contacted the web provider where the site was hosted. They had it shut down within an hour! Over that next year I think I had another five or six sites shut down under similar circumstances... :-)
