Yes, I've worked out that much. I can create and delete partitions. What I'm having trouble with currently is getting the "Ghost" department to work properly, so I can load these new partitions with OS's.

One other thing I've noticed is that it seems while you can have up to 255 primary partitions on a drive, you can only actually see 4 at any one time from any given OS, because WinXP refuses to see more than 4. I believe I've pretty much sussed how to deal with all that side of things though. Soon as I get the Ghost thingy happening I'll be cool. You can't use normal Ghost of course when you've created partitions with BootItNG.
