I am having an issue with Paris all of a sudden. When I try to launch it goes through the opening process and then when I should see the main screen, it disappears completely. If I try to launch again, it shuts the computer down.

I have been running Paris for the past two years without much trouble on this computer, but today I loaded some new plugs and this happened. (HP dualcore running XP sp2)

I uninstalled the new plugs and also re-installed Paris, but neither fixed the problem. I tried to run Paris after running a restore point, but that didn't work.

I am wondering if I need to uninstall Paris and delete the EMU completely before reinstalling Paris?

Can anyone help me with this problem?

I know that I have seen this error before, but I can't remember how I fixed it. Any Ideas?
