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Gantt,

The best way I've found to do this is to open the sequence editor, select a point past the end of the song on the timeline, arm all tracks and record a few seconds of silence. Select all those silent "soundbites" and drag them to very beginning of the timeline. Now select all of the soundbites in the project. Go to the "Audio" menu dropdown and select "merge soundbites" (I think that's it anyway). Now you should have all of the tracks starting at zero. There may an easier way, but I haven't found it yet. I got spoiled by the "render tracks" command in PARIS, as it inserts the silence back to zero for you automatically. Anyway, hope this helps.
