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Hey Bill,

Are you the guitar player? You have a few Robben Ford CDs in the car CD changer don't you? Very nice playing, has that very vocal, vowel sounding tone that good distorted blues/jazz/rock guitar sounds do.

I've used Groove Agent on occasion but think it's almost always best replaced by a real drummer even if he's only using triggers for the cymbals. You'll get much more dynamics even if the drummer is trying to play like a robot.

Still, very nice work. I was close to having those kind of chops at one point in my life but I sure as hell don't anymore.
