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Hi folks. "What computer configurations does PARIS work well with?" has long been an FAQ here. Mike's multi-core drivers have opened up many new potential configurations, which has made that an even more urgent question.

My skills haven't been up to creating such a database in a way that would make the info easily entered and easily sorted. But the infrastructure to (relatively) easily create such a database finally dropped into my lap this week, so now the work begins.

So now I need to know - what do we reckon we want included?

Also - since the database won't be smart enough to read text and turn it into meaningful entries - we should constrain the possible range of answers to fixed answers whenever possible (and leave room for expansion of the fields too), so how do we want it entered?

Here's a start I made, and I hope you folks can help me refine it before we put it into action and start gathering info.

- 1) Motherboard - (text entry)
- 2) Model - (text entry)
- 3) Chipset - (text entry)
- 4) Revision - (text entry)
- 5) BIOS version - (text entry)
- 6) CPU - (radio button) single core / multicore
- 7) CPU type and model - (text entry)
- 8) RAM - type / amount / speed - (text entry)

- 9) Video card slot type: (radio button) AGP/PCI/PCIe
- 10) Video card manufacturer - (text entry)
- 11) Video card type - (text entry)
- 12) Video card model - (text entry)

- 13) Number of EDS cards in this rig (radio button) 1-8
- 13a) Number of MECs in this rig (dropdown) 0-8
- 13b) Using external word clock (radio button) yes/no
- 14) Number of onboard PCI slots on mobo - (dropdown) 0-8
- 15) Other types of slots on mobo - (radio button) none / PCIX / PCIe
- 16) Using expansion chassis (radio button) none / Magma / VirtuaVia
- 17) Number of UAD1 cards (dropdown) none / 1 / 2 / 3 / 4
- 18) Number of UAD2 cards (dropdown) none / 1 / 2 / 3 / 4
- 19) List other audio-related cards such as Creamware - (text entry)

- 19a) I run PARIS in sync with other audio applications (dropdown) never / on this computer / on a

different computer

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You can get your BIOS info from your PC at bootup by holding down a key combination (which I forget and hope someone else will contribute here). But BIOS won't be a required question. Only a few of the questions will require an answer, the rest will be "if you happen to know" or "if you feel like answering". Of course, the more info we have the more useful the database will be.

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OK, note the new entries at 19 to 19e. I'm not happy with that way of getting at the info - there must be a more elegant way to ask the questions so we get info we can sort and use. Any ideas before I make a new revision? Your input options are:

- radio button: check one entry (ie yes/no/dunno) from multiple choice list
- check box: check one *or more* entries from multiple choice list
- drop down select: select one entry from multiple choice dropdown

(text boxes or text entry should be saved for absolute last resort since it's much harder to sort and search raw text).

Just ask "what will *I* be looking for when I upgrade my own current PARIS rig, and how will I want to see it presented?"
