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Are there any other Mac guys using the UAD-1 plugins? I'm getting weird noises - clicks and pops and loud fog-horn-like noises when I use the UAD-1 plugins.

It seems like I'm OK if I only use them on 4, maybe 5 tracks, but if my usage meter gets up over 40% - 50% the strangeness begins. I have two cards, so I would think I'd be able to run more plugins without problems. The UA guys won't even try to help me once they find out I'm running Paris in OS 9! I tried re-installing Paris and the UAD-1 3.9 drivers withg no luck...

I may try re-installing OS 9.

I'm also having more crashes than usual, but I don't know that I can attribute them to UAD-1 issues.
