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here is the scenario, I am running this mix through a pair of BAE 312;s for some coloration, the thing sounds great perfect absolutely brilliant, don't touch a thing type or deal, however, as I was dumping the mix down, I noticed on snare hit clipping the 8in lights...just one snare hit in the whole song. Now I tried muting the snare tracks, and of course the clip lights did not fire.
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So the only way to avoid this is to back down the submix faders goin inot the 312's but I really feel this is diminishing the entire mix.
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Anyway, this track is maybe one of the coolest things I have ever worked on, to all or any of you Clash fans out there, this is gonna blow your minds (i hope!)
So thanks for the help.
