I posted this a couple days ago but I am going to elaborate.

I recently installed a third eds and got a magma chassis. I was messing around with the clock settings on some transfers that came in from tape when all hell broke loose. All the submix meters dimed and I couldnt close paris. When I got it closed I reopened it and the meters were still all the way up, tried again and everything looked normal. The audio on subA was really hashy Sounded like a clocking issue. The project that I saved before this happened works great on all 3 cards. Any thing I do since that has the same problem. I thought the audio may somehow have been corrupted so I trashed it and transfered it in again. Same problem. I used a good project and transfered the audio into it, Same problem. The problem follows the audio from card A around. I was going to do a clean install of paris but havent been able to locate my 3.0 disc. What could I have damaged? Like I say all the projects from before this occured are fine. If anyone has any ideas Id like to hear them. Aaron Allen said it sounds like a video card problem. I dont know how to check that out. Also , When I have a screen up and I move the mouse I get the same noise on those projects. If anyone knows what is going on here, please feel free to call me or email your # so I can call you. Maybe try re-installing the vidcard driver first.

Another thing I'm thinking is clocking. How do you sync up Paris to the 2 inch? Does your problem still persist when you record a fresh audio track into that ppj? (just recording, not a transfer)
