I have really enjoyed this mix.
It is helping me understand and get acquainted with my new mixing environment.
I will post a pic of my studio soon too. At first I tried soloing the guitars

and the vox and making EQ edits on how I thought they should fit together like puzzle pieces. This quickly sounded like sh*t. I zeroed everything out and for the first time ever I actually started with the vox...making minor EQ adjustments to level it out and then bringing up the guitars. I then proceeded to EQ the guitars with the vox playing. I have always read to avoid soloing instruments during mixing...yet I never did it...until now.. I am very pleased with the results. The mix came together rather quickly. I am using SIR with a PCM90 verb.
