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I couldn't agree with this sentiment more.

For the last few years I've been mucking about with my music, creating very little, largely because of the sound of this or that not being up to scratch. Or some production issue or another.

Recently I've found a whole new way of working. It violates half of my "It's all about the sound" ideas and comes back to the basics of putting down a song, as quickly as possible, while the energy for that song is there and fresh. I've set up a whole bunch of my favourite sounds, which could still

be tweaked, but I'm focussing on using them, not tweaking. I've got a Digitech GNX-4 which I use in loop mode to do the basic recording (not Paris). Once I have a bunch of loops all prepared I can simply switch the wav files over to Paris, drop them in an order I like and the song is done. I then add vocals very quickly and move on to another song.

So far I've only done one tune, but it was last week, and it worked, and worked well for mine. I had fun, I like the product, and the sound is not too shabby anyhow. It's the quickest way to work I've ever found, and I like it.

As Nike would say... "Just do it".
