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Well, here in Australia, at least, Radio stations pay a yearly "blanket" fee for the rights to play music.

They don't pay per performance.

In my days in radio, (early 70's), we had to log all tracks played, (well before computer anything), and a monthly sample was averaged out over the year, and that's what we paid.
