>Vegas is a very good option for anyone used to audio apps - IMHO, it is much
more intuitive than Avid, Edius, etc, with a similar workflow to native DAWs
(easy to click, drag, fade, crossfade, clips etc - this requires a key/mouse
combination in most other NLE's). Premiere is a great program, but is
finicky about system config (i.e. I don't recommend installing it on the
same system as an audio app like Cubase, etc, but it can work). Vegas can
sync to MTC.

FCP is great if you are on a Mac, but I find Vegas' workflow faster (I have
it on my Nuendo system and just switch back and forth at will). That said,
Vegas approach is different than the standard Avid approach (which IMHO, is
convoluted and poorly thought out, unless you like multiple key commands for
every action) so if your goal is to be ready to work in other production
houses editing, Avid Express might be a good idea to learn, then use Vegas
for actual work. I'm writing a review of it for Audiomidi.com right now as
well as using it for a documentary and several other projects - the review
probably won't be online until February though.
