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Hey Rich,

I think the best way is to bring seperate .wav files for each track into PARIS. Just burn to a cd or use a hard drive.

Make sure the files all start at the same time, the zero line.

I've had success this way. If they don't open for some reason there is the utility stripwav that helps. Removes some header info or something.

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I go back and forth all the time, as a matter of fact I am consolidating PT files at this moment for a mix tomorrow (I keep a 002 system mostly for this).

Be sure and consolidate all the files back to the zero start and there are no problems. I export them to a folder and batch convert them into Paris. I use a program that Tankersley turned me onto a long time ago called AWave. It takes the whole folder and moves them with the right .wav thing so Paris sees them. It's actually pretty quick...
