>There are lots of *possible* explanations.....such as the fact that Nigeria is an oil *exporting* country. It may have an actual surplus of oil, per capita and it's also possible that there are subsidized or artificial price controls on domestic production due to the royalty structuring of the operating agreements with the corporations who are producing the oil, in other words, Nigeria's royalties may be taken *in kind* rather than *in cash* or a combination of both, which could, given very productive wells, create an actual oil surplus within it's borders. I have4n't studied this so it's pure speculation on my part and may be woron, but the above scenarios are definitely possible.
