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PARIS 2.2 software is available at that link and it's free. PARIS 3.0 is \$100 (I believe - I paid for mine years ago) [edited eight months later to add: that's because I bought it used as a license transfer - I had no idea at that time that it could possibly be \$295 new!]; you download and install it and that starts a seven day trial period. Within that period (I'd do it at the beginning to avoid it expiring before you get an authorization), you receive a challenge code which you email to Intelligent Devices along with payment and receive an authorization key in return.

You don't have to go with 3.0, some people haven't. But it does have some very cool features.

But to get the most out of your PARIS rig, IMHO buying PARIS 3.0 (\$100) and Mike's drivers (\$50) is definitely the way to go. The drivers you saw advertised on ebay were the same ones available at Mike's link (: : mikeaudet :: at the top of this page).
