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Last year I was using the MEC internal clock and analog outputs with an Alesis RA-100 and Yamaha NS-10s. I changed to a Big Ben clock, a Benchmark DAC and Adam's A7. I have a 2 EDS card system and one MEC with two 8-ins. In each category I definitely noticed a difference and I heard improvements to the Paris sound. With the clock I heard better low end clarity. With the DAC I heard better overall tightness and depth. Both together gave me better stereo imaging and tightness, especially in the low end bass and kick drum. The A7's just made listening more enjoyable.
