It's usually one of two things. Heat or oxidation on the daughterboard contacts. If it's oxidation, like it was on mine, just remove the daughterboard and get some contact cleaner and a toothbrush and scrub them really good. Regarding heat, EDS cards get REALLY hot so you have to have serious extra fans going o keep their life, otherwise they die a short life.
