I'm talking guitar cables or audio line cables.

Secondly, I thinking of purchasing the Behringer CT-100 cable tester (\$30 at zzSounds, \$40 at a local GC). The spec states it can detect intermittent problems. I've researched the Nady, ART and two others (I forget the names) and they all seem to do the same thing but at a higher price point. Any recommendations from users or studio engineers?
