You can dig around many forums and see people reporting issues with the ASIO part of Audition. Adobe hasn't released any sort of update for Audition. It stills seems related to Auditions behavior with cards that have over 16 channels of I/O. Perhaps on some the Adobe forums or other places there may be a work around or fix. The only one I know of is to use the WDM. If all someone is doing is mastering or editing then you really shouldn't need the ASIO driver at all.
