Most of my team at Xerox has gone to MacBook Pro computers running Parallels and it is fantastic. I have created virtual machines of Win 2k, XP, Vista Home, Vista Ultimate and SuSe Linux.

Things can get a bit slow when running 3 or 4 VMs simultaneously.

Most of us have OS X and XP running side-by-side on dual monitors and it really is the best of both worlds.

However, I can't comment on running Windows audio apps in this configuration as I haven't tried. It does, however, run our Windows VPN software with no problems whatsoever.
