The NS10s were bang on. No tweaking needed. Reverb levels, vocal levels, eq, everything - bang on - and bang on despite the car system sounding very different. These things are worth their weight in gold.

I was also able to fix a problem in the acoustic guitar track that they brought with them. I could hear the problem at 1k immediately. Didn't even need to sweep the eq.

These represent the best money I have ever spent.
