Quote: The user may have a problem on his system; or even a firewall or anti-virus program that blocks remote javascript (AJAX) calls.

Things to try:

- Check if other AJAX-based sites are working
- Try to disable firewall and/or anti-virus software
- Run a program like IEFix
- Upgrade to IE8
