Yep. I use a Dell usb keyboard on my G4, and F12 works the same as the eject key. You just need to hold it down a little longer.

I can't remember it at the moment, but there is a little app that you install into the control panel that allows you to remap the windows key as the squiggle key, and stuff like that.
