If there's nothing on the right side of your patchbay window, then there's a problem.....I'd guess the SCSI cable isn't hitting on all pins. Try reseating it and rebooting.....which may solve the problem below also.....

> I have the MEC and C-16 connected, but no inputs or outputs on the MEC yet.
> The C-16 seems to be functioning normally. The MEC has a flashing yellow
> led on internal sync??? Help, Edna

This isn't normal. Assuming that your SCSI cable between the EDS card and the MEC is OK/seated properly, the sync light should only flash when the hardware is initializing. Go to your Paris project window and flip the sync source from internal to another setting like Word clock, let it sit for about 15 seconds, then switch it back to internal and see if the clock locks up correctly.

The only other thought I have on this is that the XP drivers may not be shaking hands with your hardware. It's been so long since I've used Paris XP, that I think others here can probably be of more help in this area than I could be.
