er... can't you select all (well, within 'that' submix anyway) and render them all at once either to disk as a selection or as a track? This should give you 5 flattened tracks in the example you give.
Now, if you're looking for a render to mix, that's another animal - no go in Paris. That's a native DAW trick. Mixdown is real time in Paris.
