IMHO IE 7 and IE 8 both are unstable, and I don't like either. Pages don't load right, or at all, sometimes on multiple machines. I admin 150-ish computers and 5 servers, plus my 6 home boxes that are on a lot (I have over 10, but not always running). I'll not be putting IE8 on the work machines just yet, except my desktop - it gets the 'test' work done on it before I subject users to it.

However, the recommendations I've given in the past about staying off XP SP3 has more to do with hogging RAM than anything else.
