Nothing.

It's dead. Will not boot, will not find the drive, will not startup on CD from the OS disc, will not startup from Apple hardware test CD. Nothing but blinking "cant find system folder" icon.

Tried all the pram resets and single user mode tricks. nada. Once it booted halfway up and then totally froze up.

Logic board. A used one is 350 installed and it will die in months. They all do.
