The settings depend alot on how many tracks and how many edits you have. I personally use 128k in the i/o and 128 meg in the Disk Cache. I also set the overview cache to 8192 if I don't have a lot of edits, but typically by the time I get to mix stage I'll up it to 21000k. I currently have it there.

I have, on occasion, upped the i/o AND cache to 256 (need to manually edit the paris config file for the i/o) and set the ove cache to 256000. I can't vouche for the settings in your situation....I'm on a PC, but upping them will definatly get rid of the error. You just have to strike a balance between no error and Paris running a little more sluggishly as it has to take bigger bites data.
