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Just as an FYI, if you haven't heard the PARIS-compatible reverbs that Mike Audet has ported over from the DP 4, the DP Pro, and the original PARIS Hall reverb, you really owe it to yourself to pick these items up.

For a very reasonable price you can get some too smooth sounds happening in your PARIS rig. I've been using a couple of Lexicon outboard reverbs for some time now on my external effects. The DP Pro hall just blows them away. I use a TC Electronics reverb in my live performance rack. I wish I could get that lush sound like the DP Pro in PARIS on my live sound system. It's like having a Heaven knob on your console.

If you haven't already done so, buy these reverbs for your PARIS rig. You'll be supporting a good cause... more whistles and bells to make PARIS even better.
