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Hey,

i'm just playing around with the demo of the waves sll4000. It works with Paris 3.0 / Win XP, but as soon I open up the plugin for editing I get streaming errors after ten seconds or so. Doesn't happen with any other plugins. I can put sll plugs in up to 16 channels and got no problem with streaming as long as I don't open the graphical interface. I tried it with FXpansion and FFX4 with no luck.

I have a Athlon XP 3000 with AsRock K7VT6-C and 512Mb RAM.

Does anyone have an idea what to do? Would be sad if they don't work within Paris, or am I just dreaming...
