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Yeah, Cuj, I was just thinking... I don't know of ANY widespread 1"/16 format other than Tascam. Fostex had a 1/2"/16, and IIRC made ONE model of a 1"/16, but not for very long, and I don't think there were very many produced... ISTR

that one might've had Dolby "C". I know some of their 1/2" 16tracks did.
