1) XLN Addictive Drums.. Killer (easy) Interface with great sounding kits.

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That can contiunes to grow with your library. The Lib that comes with Battery is killer in it's own right.

3) Stylus(Original) & Stylus RMX.. Again, for the R&B/Dance Techno, Hip Hop..Stylus is a must..

4) Ez Drummer(Nashville, Latin, Claustrophobic, Vintage Rock). These babys cover a lot of ground. Sound s great and very EZ interface.
