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Hey Tom, I wouldn't worry about too much Neve sound with the Neve EQs and compressors. I used to have a 3360 comp and its sound was very warm, sweet and luscious. Using Neve pres and EQs and comps together is not like putting chocolate syrup on chocolate ice cream (actually, that sounds good). In fact they were designed to complement each other in a console, by one of the best audio designers of all time - you won't get a Neve "buildup" problem.

I don't doubt Rupert builds in a beautiful sound into almost everything he touches. Oddly, I had a hard time liking the Neve comp (UAD) when I gave it a spin. It seemed difficult to setup for seemingly not a huge audio gain. I'm sure I missed something there. It's cpu hungry tendency drove me away. I do like the Fairchild although rarely and frequently use the La2a and 1176.

I have heard engineers complain of the Neve buildup issue regarding consoles though. I like to use the hardware Neve pres as spice to bring some more attention to certain tracks.

If I get the UAD-2 I'll have the resources to try the Neve comp again and understand it's use. Have you got any tips there?
