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If both systems are Mac (PTHD & PARIS) then SD2s are best. If they are stereo files, you can import them directly into PARIS using Audio>Add audio file in the Audio window or the arrange window. (It will split the stereo files and create PAFs). If none of the files are stereo, and you have a bunch of tracks, using PAF>SD2 convert is faster.

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You probably know this already, but if my recollection is correct, the PARIS app will refuse to import SDII files unless you remember to actually label them with the .sd2 file extension, ie kick.sd2. It won't just see them by their type/creator code like other Mac apps; that was a brief show-stopper for me until I realized what was going on.
