In case you haven't been watching the threads... with the gigabyte motherboard, I sorted out all the issues in the end. I beleive there was a dodgy WinXP disk involved in most of my issues, and in the end I discovered that the board I got was faulty, as the SATA ports on the board died in the end, and it's now been taken back to the store for replacement.
