impressed thus far), and if you don't mind dealing with ethics, =
behringer makes some decent stuff for the money given that you may we be =
returning some of it / exchanging over QC issues. I have not been =
impressed with Fender pa stuff, basically since they bought out Sunn =
many years ago.=20

On the whole, all-in-one pa systems are bad because if something fails, =
you lose it all. But if you're wanting to go that direction: Soundcraft =
has the Gigrac with adequate built in power. A friend had one and tied =
it into some EV's on a stick (pole mounted 12" w/horn).. think those =
were a sx300 model. Bright, but for your description, probably just =
about right. You won't get much kick or bass in these, but sounds like =
it's going to be mostly vocals?

Have you thought about used gear? Hit the local pawn brokers and =
newspaper ads, see what's out there for the money.

Hey Sara,

I've been out of the live world for some time, but I'd agree with some of the comments thus far: I stay away from all in one solutions -as noted you're not totally out of luck if one component dies, and I'd consider used gear. As with buying all things used you have to think about the gear's history -how much use has it had, and what sort of music was played through it. This is of course especially true for speakers. Where the gears been used seems to matter too. My repair guy tells me that cigarette smoke does for circuits boards and electrical connections favors similar to those it grants to our lungs. (I always thought it was just an issue with odor -not so apparently.)

I've listened to some of your demos and I gather you'd be playing with more than a few players. So, I'd also agree that some sort of monitor system would probably be helpful. However, I would note that our trio, if the club was small enough and the crowd noise was low enough, could often play without monitors. Of course those are two big if's that can change pretty quickly. If I was going to go out again I'd really be looking at some sort of in-ear system. Wedges can certainly work, but feedback can be a real issue. Another thing you might consider is a wireless mic system. I say this not because I'm familiar with them, but I AM familiar with running mic cables ...and coiling them, and storing them, and cleaning them, and color coding them, and tripping over them, and hiding them (to make the stage look less cluttered.) Maybe someone will chime in and correct me that wireless system have sonic or setup problems that make "wired" mics a better choice. Just a thought.

Gear aside, it sounds like playing out may be a new thing for you? If so, even if you're playing through the most basic of setups -its an absolute gas.

Folks around here with long memories might remember that I tend to the dirt cheap end of things. I now live by Craigslist. I picked up a 30 watt Roland monitor the other day that has an xlr in as well as three channels of line and instrument in, and the other day I had two keyboards going through it, playing bass on one, and it sounded stunning.

I do a duo thing with a singing guitar player, and we both have Ibanez amps (did you even know they made them? I didn't until I went to the local guitar shop to check out cheap Fender bass amps) -- I have a bass amp and the other guy has a guitar amp (with an xlr in) which he sings and plays through. I have a tiny mixer which I use to put my vocals as well as bass through mine. Everyone in a small cafe we play in says it sounds great. No monitors needed - we just set up with the amps somewhat behind us. On the lastest of these gigs I used my new monitor instead of the mixer, and it sounded even better.

Both these Ibanez amps were under \$200. Astounding.
