It seems like I'm presented with two different approaches:

1. This guitarscales thingy is teaching 5 "grid" patterns that contain within them all the modes and scales needed. But you don't really learn the scale pattern per se. Essentially, you learn these grids and from there you learn

scale patterns, modes etc...

2. The other approach seems to be to learn scale patterns for all the modes, gradually increasing your scale pattern vocabulary, and learn the notes on the entire neck. None of this grid stuff.

The BCF2000 is definitely defective. The driver loading procedure requires
the user to plug the unit in, wait for Windows to recognize new hardware,
then to double click on a .exe file which loads the driver. This unit is not
recognized as new hardware by Windows. I have tried every permutation I know
of to get a driver to work. The driver shows up in the device manager, but
in the configuration panel for the Mackie control in SX (the device this POS
is supposed to emulate), only an input device shows up. According to
Behringer tech support, this ain't right at all. It's going back to MF in
the AM. I've spent two days of my life dealing with this evil piece of crap.
No more.

> My advice, learn how to play vocal lines on guitar. Pay attention to the subtle
nuances in the phrasing, it'll give you a good sense of where to vibrato,
or slide, and where legato makes more sense than staccato.

Once you can play vocal melodies with ease, just start singing your own melodies,
and play them. Eventually, the notes will just appear in your head, and your
fingers will know where to go (most of the time).

Knowing the scales patterns isn't a bad thing, but I see them as mostly useful
when the melody isn't happening in your head yet, and you want to have a
'safe' set of notes to fall back on. Me, I see improvisation as happening
on a number of levels. At the outer level there's a thought process where
you might think about what sort of 'feel' you want to use. This influences
the tone, and registers that you use. Then at the innermost level there's
the scales and licks that you know by heart that you can hit on periodically.
The whole process involves sometimes thinking about every note, then switching
to 'autopilot' for a phrase or two, then back to more context sensitive melodies.
Rapid fire sequences are not typically really improvised, it's more like
a thought process you think, I'm at this note right now, and want maybe
a rapid sequence up to some sustained note, so you blast through a sequence
and maybe along the way hear a note that speaks to you, so you hang on to
it for a while.

Really the key is to practice, and really listen to what you play. Try singing
notes in your head, and matching them on the guitar. You'll get good at it
in no time...
