It's a really nice sounding piano to start with (48" tall). I tried a lot of setups but ended up with modified m/s over Paul's right shoulder facing the front of the piano (Microtech Gefell UMT70s in omni for the mid, and another UMT70s in figure 8 for the side) plus a Soundelux U195 in the back for more lows. At first the sound was too wet, so we moved the piano against the absorptive wall. Hardy M-1 for preamps.
