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There was a rudimentary ASIO driver written for the EDS card a few years back. If your software will work with ASIO, then there's a chance you could use this if you can find it, otherwise you're SOL. No MME or WDM drivers exist for the EDS card.

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I know this isn't exactly what you're asking but I've always used a digital soundcard (used to use a DatPort, now it's just built in to the motherboard) to output into PARIS. Then use the patch bay to map it to 2 tracks and then you can use PARIS to control the volume of your computer and such.
