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Well, most folks would say that treating the final stereo mix as a whole with separate processing is the key to getting the end result you're looking for. Whether it's a Finalizer 96K or analog boxes is up to your preferences and budget. The Finalizer goes for pretty cheap used - it's almost 10 years old now. I bring the bounced stereo stems back onto 2 tracks and use Native eqs with an Alan Smart C1 +/- or a Fatso externally. Izotope Ozone is also a good all in one software tool for Mastering.
