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If you must use 2bus plugs, your best bet is to keep the load on the Master card as light as possible. This will save resources for Global plug-ins. Personally I prefer to mix without any global inserts, then process after the fact. You can import the stereo mix files back into Paris and process on the channel strips, which gives you more options for EQ and dynamics. The interconnect ribbons are easy enough to make... find an electronic parts supplier and build them yourself.
