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Yeh, it's all kinda complex. Doug Wellington owns the parisnewsgroup.com domain not me. He still has the www.parisnewsgroup.com domain pointed at his FAQ's site, whereas news.parisnewsgroup.com points at my server, and webnews.parisnewsgroup.com points at my domain paris.hiddenounds.com, which in turn points at my server, hence both go to the newsgroup's website if you put the in a browser. I think part of the reason for this arrangement was that parisfaqs became the default fallback Paris site while the newsgroup changeover was occuring.

It seems that google doesn't particularly like what Doug's done though, as www.parisnewsgroup.com doesn't even show on any of the searches I did. Kind of a waste of a good URL really.

But it's Doug's domain so it's up to him.
