Restart your machine at this point in time. When you come back the first thing you should do is defrag the main drive even if it doesn't say it needs it. This way the swap file has been truly set and you're ready to continue.

Processor scheduling should be set to background services and not Programs.

Disable System Sounds

Do Not Map Through Soundcard

Start > Settings > Control Panel > Sounds and Audio Devices > Hardware Tab > (highlight your soundcard from the list) > Properties > Audio Devices > (highlight your soundcard from the list) > Properties, and check the "Do not map through this device" checkbox.

Disable System Restore

Start > Settings > Control Panel > System > System Restore Tab. Tick the "Turn off System Restore on all Drives"

Disable Automatic Updates

Switch off Automatic Updates by going to Control Panel, System, Automatic Updates and ticking the box labelled "Turn off automatic updating. I want to update my computer manually."

Startup and Recovery Options

Right click My Computer and click on Properties > Advanced > Start Up & Recovery Settings and uncheck "Automatically Restart".

Disable Error Reporting

Start > Settings > Control Panel > System > Advanced TAB > Error Reporting > Click the Disable Error Reporting box (Tick the "But Notify Me When Critical Errors Occur" if you prefer)

Disable Remote Assistance

Start > Settings > Control Panel > System > Remote > Untick "Allow Remote Assistance Invitations to be sent from this computer"

Disable Remote Desktop

Start > Settings > Control Panel > System > Remote > Untick "Allow users to connect remotely to this computer"

Fixed Swap File (Virtual Memory)

Select the Advanced tab of the Systems applet and then select the Performance settings button. Then select the Advanced page. In here it is possible to customise the Virtual Memory. For custom size, this is often recommended to be 1.5 to 2 times the amount of your total RAM for both initial and maximum size. Set this to a fixed minimum and maximum value according to your existing RAM

Speed Up Menu

You can use this tip to speed up the Start Menu in Windows XP. You can customize the speed of the Start Menu by editing a Registry Key. Click Start, and then click Run. Type Regedit in the box, and then click OK.

Expand the menu in the left panel and select the HKEY_CURRENT_USER\Control Panel\Desktop folder. Scroll down in the right panel and double click on the MenuShowDelay file. In the Value Data box, change to default value for the menu speed from 400 to a lesser number, such as 1. Click OK.

Disable Offline Files

Disable Notification Area Balloon Tips

Click Start , click Run , type regedit , and then press ENTER.
HKEY_CURRENT_USER\Software\Microsoft\Windows\CurrentVersion\Explorer\Advanced Right-click the right pane, create a new DWORD value, and then name it EnableBalloonTips . Double-click this new entry, and then give it a hexadecimal value of 0 . Quit Registry Editor. Log off Windows, and then log back on.

Disable CDROM Autoplay

One of the very important (and well documented) tweaks in Windows 98SE, was to disable CDROM autoplay (auto insert notification). Disabling CDROM autoplay no longer offers a significant performance benefit in Windows XP, and therefore you do not need to disable it. Just don't insert a CD during a crucial recording.

However, if you really want to disable it then here a few different methods.

Method 1

Start > Run > Regedit

HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\System\CurrentControlSet\Services\Cdrom

Set autorun to 0.

Method 2

Open My Computer Right Click on each CDROM and choose Properties Click on the Auto Play tab In the drop down box you can choose the Action for each choice shown in the drop down box

Method 3

Go to Start->Run->gpedit.msc Computer Config -> Administrative Template -> System Double click Turn off Autoplay Enable it.

Disable Disc Indexing

Indexing Service is a service that extracts the information from a set of documents and organizes it in a way that makes it quick and easy to access that information through the Windows XP Search function, the Indexing Service query form, or a Web browser.

This information can include text from within a document, (its contents), and the characteristics and parameters of the document, (its properties), such as the author's name. Once the index is created, you can search, or query the index for documents that contain key words, phrases, or properties.

Additional tips Descriptions

Partitioning. A useful tip when configuring your audio disc, is to split this into two partitions. Set up a smaller "audio scratch" partition - say 6GB of a 30GB hard disc. This partition will be used for the songs that you are currently working on. The benefit of a smaller partition is obviously quicker defragmentation. If you use the entire 30GB as one partition, then this will take ages to defragment. When you are finished with a song, transfer the audio files to the non-scratch partition, where disc I/O performance isn't so critical.

Increase your IRQ priority - You can increase the IRQ priority of the real-time CMOS clock to gain some system performance by doing the following:

- 1.) First create a text file with the extension .reg
- 2.) Paste the following into the file:

REGEDIT4

```
[HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\System\CurrentControlSet\Control\PriorityControl]
"IRQ8Priority"=dword:00000001
```

- 3.) Double-click on the file to enter the tweak into your registry.

This can be un-installed should you need to by repeating the three steps above with a new file, except this time use the following in your .reg file:

Disable Power Management - Power management can be disabled by going

to "Always On" and set "System Standby", "Turn off hard disks" and "Turn off monitor" to "Never".

Set graphic acceleration to full - You can do this by going to your desktop, right clicking and clicking on "Properties" then on "Settings", "Advanced" and the "Performance" tab. Make sure the Hardware Acceleration slider is set to "full" to reduce the load on your CPU.

Disable background applications - Background applications start up when your computer starts up and can use up unnecessary resources. To prevent

box. Click on the "startup tab" and disable (uncheck) programs such as "taskmon", "load power profile", "real player", "office startup", "winamp agent" and so on. Keep programs like "scan registry", "system tray" and programs relating to interfacing with your audio card (such as console software to control its features).

Disable USB - If you do not have any devices actively using USB in your system (this includes dongles for your software), disable USB as it is known to sometimes cause problems in certain DAW configurations. Not only will this help to increase system performance, but it will also free up an IRQ. Right click on your "My Computer" icon on your desktop and select "Properties". Click on the "Device Manager" tab and scroll down until you see the USB section. Click on the "Properties" for the USB device and check off "Disable in this Hardware Profile". You will have to reboot for these settings to take effect.

I love Disk Suite my go to proggy for reformatting, partitioning, erasing HDD, Multiple OS partitions etc., but it should not be used lightly on a trial basis. It beats Norton Utilities hands down for my needs.

I've never had a problem with an EDS card sharing with my AGP device or anything else.

Maybe I've been lucky. I don't know.

Also, this is very theoretical, but my understanding is that PCI cards don't even use IRQs the way ISA cards used them. The BIOS assignment is just for legacy use. I suspect that Windows XP ignores them completely and directly uses the 4 interrupts (A, B, C, and D) that PCI cards can "really" use. The PCI spec requires interrupt sharing at the hardware level. An IRQ number assigned in the bios is just a pointer to one of these "real" interrupts in case old software goes looking for an ISA device.

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Hi, John.

No sound card, as all slots are full.

For any multimedia sound, I use the spdif out into my old Sony DAT recorder.

The first two slots have the Nvidia Quadro dual heads.

(Obviously the first slot being the AGP, and the PCI version is next to it.)

The other four PCI slots (The K8NS ultra 939 has five), have my four EDS 1000 cards.

As mentioned, I disabled SATA, as I don't use it, and also the parallel and game ports.

Firewire is active, so if I need to I can hook up my Maudio

Firewire Audiophile. (The K8NS has the Texas Instruments 1394 chipset, which is cool!).

RAM is generic 768mb DDR in DDR slots 1&3. (Dual channel would be better ofcourse, but I used what I had in my old comp.)

Drives are Western Digital 2500JB (boot) and whatever else I have in my removeable caddies (Mainly WD's), for audio. I use the boot drive as backup storage for works in progress.

Nice and quick, as the two are on seperate IDE channels.

One thing I did initially during windows install, was to use a single Nvidia MX400 geforce graphics card. After a flawless setup,

I then installed both Quadras with drivers, then the EDS's.

Yes, and I HAVE imaged every step of the way.

(Haven't had to roll-back yet.)
