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I wonder if someone like Chuck might know how to ID a v3 ppj file vs a v2? Just thinking that if that's not the issue, you could have any number of people try to open those projects on their v3 Paris rigs & they still might not be able to.

With regard to the # of tracks that have edits/punches/comps, do you think the basic tracks have that too? I was just

thinking that if most of the tracks are single takes, but a handful had punches/comps, etc, you might be able to import the audio files & reconstruct the project, with the basic tracks being a simple one-shot import, and with most of the labor being spent on getting the overlaps/punch points right for the overdubbed tracks. You'd have to have the artist there for that portion, of course, so he could tell you which portions of the take are "the one".
